



Dr. Scott T. Micek
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Dr. Micek is a professor in the Department of Pharmacy Practice at the St. Louis College of Pharmacy, where he is the director of the Center for Health Outcomes Research and Education, and a critical care clinical pharmacist at Barnes-Jewish Hospital, where he is a practitioner on the interdisciplinary medical ICU team. Dr. Micek earned his Pharm.D. degree from the University of Iowa and completed a pharmacy practice residency at Barnes-Jewish Hospital. He previously served as supervisor of critical care pharmacists and director of PGY1 pharmacy practice and PGY2 critical care residency programs.

Dr. Micek's research interests have focused on the antimicrobial management of critically ill patients. His scholarly work has been funded by grants/awards from various foundations and the pharmaceutical industry. His research has resulted in over 80 original research publications and 50 plus review articles which have been cited by over 8,000 papers. Students, residents, and fellows in training have collaborated with Dr. Micek on 65 publications over the past 15 years.

Dr. Micek's research has been awarded special recognition at national or international meetings in 2005, 07, 09, 10, and 17. In addition, Dr. Micek led a research team that was the recipient of the Award for Excellence in Medication Use-Safety sponsored by the Cardinal Health Foundation and administered by the ASHP Research and Education Foundation in 2007. In 2013, Dr. Micek was presented the ACCP Critical Care PRN Research award. Currently, Dr. Micek serves as an elected Trustee for the ACCP Research Institute and recently participated in the year-long AACP Catalyst program titled Accelerating Research Leadership.
